Greetings and Welcome to December

It is an exciting time of the year as we are in the midst of the holiday season. We are also nearing the end of the first semester and wondering where the first half of the year went. It is also a time to plan for the upcoming year.

Building Project

The school board and administration have been spending considerable time planning a building project. The Board accepted a petition from Boyden-Hull residents calling for a special election to consider a bond issue. The Board acted on the petition and approved a resolution that calls for a special election on **February 6, 2018**. With the help of teachers and community members, we identified three primary directives:

- 1) Safety and security are our primary concern;
- 2) The secondary building needs more attention than the elementary;
- 3) Renovation and addition of educational spaces should ensure that all areas meet 21st century standards and allow for these areas to be highly functioning for decades to come.

The total cost of the project will be approximately \$11.2 million. We are asking the community for a bond of \$9.85 million, and we will finance the rest of the project through the existing sales tax. The length of this bond issuance will be twenty years. We believe that this

bond will have minimal impact on the overall property tax levy rate. We plan to have this start as the current General Obligation Bond expires in 2019. In saying minimal, we believe that through the sales tax dollars and efficient use of the Physical Plant and Equipment Levy (PPEL), Management Levy, and Cash Reserve Levy, we could keep the overall impact to less than a 20 cent increase and likely closer to a 5 to 15 cent increase. Over the course of the past ten years, the levy rate has averaged \$14.47.

I'm sure you are curious about how this bond could impact you personally. Here are some examples to help make it clear. If we use the high estimate of the levy increase of 20 cents, a house assessed at \$200,000 would see an increase of approximately \$22 per year. If you have 160 acres of land in Sioux County at the average assessed value, the increase would be \$46.21 (28.884 cents per acre). If historical trends continue, our tax base will continue to grow and these levy rates would decline over the twenty-year lifespan of the bond.

Boyden-Hull has a long history of being good stewards of the money that has been entrusted to us for educating the children of the Boyden-Hull Community School District. We have worked with other schools in the community to share resources – for example, Hesla Field. We have also partnered with Hull Christian School for the state-funded preschool opportunity. Education has been and will continue to be a high priority for the communities of Boyden and Hull.

We will continue to strive to educate at the highest level while being efficient and financially prudent.

#Standout

The public schools in Sioux County have started a campaign to promote ourselves. We are on Facebook at Sioux County Public Schools and Twitter at #Standout. Open Enrollment Option

Parents/guardians considering open enrollment for their child(ren) into another school district in Iowa need to be aware of the following deadlines for filing the required paperwork.

March 1, 2018 - This is the last date for regular open enrollment requests for the 2018-19 school year. For incoming kindergarten students, the deadline is September 1, 2018.

Applications received after these deadlines will not be approved unless the reason for late filing qualifies for "good cause." There are a number of state-approved reasons that qualify for "good cause," including moving to a new

district and change in the parents' marital status.

Transportation Assistance - Parents are responsible for transporting children open enrolled to another district. This applies to all students including those with an IEP. If the need for transportation as a related service is stated in the IEP, as a general rule the parent is responsible for this obligation under open enrollment. If a child open enrolls to a district that is contiguous (borders) to the home district, and the parents' income meets economic eligibility requirements, the family may receive a stipend for transportation or be provided transportation by the district. Income verification must be provided to the resident district.

Students that open enroll in grades 9 through 12, shall not be eligible to participate in varsity contests and competitions during the first 90 school days of transfer. Please contact the Iowa Girls High School Athletic Union at (515) 288-9741 or the Iowa High School Athletic Association at (515) 432-2011 for questions regarding eligibility.

COLD WEATHER CLOTHING

This is a reminder that it is important for students to come to school dressed warmly and prepared to play outdoors this winter. We will usually send them outside for fresh air and exercise at recess from 0 to -10 degrees including the wind factor. Students should wear winter coats, boots, mittens or gloves, a hat or hood, and something on their legs. The children will enjoy recess more if they are warm and learn better after recess if their socks, shoes, and clothes are dry.

Depending on playground conditions, students may be limited to the blacktop or certain areas if they do not have boots or snowpants.

LATE STARTS/BREAKFAST

In the event that school should start late due to weather conditions, breakfast will not be served. The late start puts the time the students would be eating breakfast and the time the noon meal is served too close together. Also, the cooks do not have enough time to clean up after breakfast before preparation for the noon meal begins. In an effort to keep confusion at a minimum, breakfast will not be served anytime school begins late.

NOTE TO ELEMENTARY PARENTS AND STUDENTS REGARDING SAFETY AT BASKETBALL GAMES

In the interest of safety, parents are asked to require their children to remain in their seats during ball games. Children and adults should leave the gym only during half-time or between games and should return to their seats before the game resumes unless an emergency arises.

The Boyden-Hull JH and HS students will be trying something a little different at the end of the school year. The description and

goals for the May Term are as follows:

What is May Term?

The 9th-11th grade high school students will select 5 mini-courses at the end of the school year the last 4 days of school. The school day will be broken into 5 blocks.

Students will have the opportunity to take courses like: First Aid, DIY Electrical, Crockpot Cooking, Geocaching, Powder Puff Mechanics, Stress Management for Teens, World Religions, and many other courses. A proposed list of courses and descriptions can be found in the November 13th Board Agenda.

JH Students will also have mini-courses they will do the last couple days of school. They will rotate through a variety of topics to expose them to a variety of subjects.

Examples of mini-courses for JH students are: Team Building, Sunday Ford, Local History, Graphic Design, Flea Flip, and others. The JH mini-courses will run 2 ½ days at the end of the school year as they will have their end of year awards and Newton Hills Trip the last day and a half.

As we approach this new adventure, students will be challenged to try something new. In order to offer

this opportunity, we will need the students to continue to do their very best in their standardized assessments so we continue to see growth in the core areas of their education. We will also need cooperation from families in keeping the students in school for these mini-courses.

WINDSHIELD TIME AND WINTER DRIVING:

LATE STARTS AND STUDENT DROP-OFF TIMES-

When school starts late for weather conditions or other scheduled teacher in-service days, it is important that parents NOT drop their children off at school before supervision is provided. The Boyden-Hull schools provide bus supervision one half hour before school begins. On days that we have a late start, it may be harmful to have students unsupervised until the bus does arrive. In the past we have had students dropped off at school at the "regular" hours, and the students have been unsupervised for two or more hours. We ask that you are aware of emergency days and other scheduled changes of school times, and make appropriate arrangements for your children.
