## REGISTRATION

Registration materials will be mailed to each family. **It is important that you fill out the forms and bring the completed forms with you to registration on August 8 or 9.** By completing the forms before you come for registration, we hope to make things run more smoothly and quickly for you. It is important to register your child(ren) before the school year begins. *If you are new to the district or registering a student in kindergarten, please bring your child's birth certificate & immunization records.*

Registration is scheduled during the second week in August to coincide with the start of Fall Sports practices the same week. Please try to make it to one of these two days for registration as it helps our secretaries get all finer details and other last minute changes taken care of. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated!

- Grades PK-6: Registration for grades PK-6 will be in Hull on Tue, Aug 8 & in Boyden on Wed, Aug 9. Parents can register at either location from 10AM-6PM.
- Grades 7-12: Registration for students entering grades 7-12 will be held Aug 8 & 9 in the Hull Principal's Office from 10AM-6PM. Please use the doors labeled "Administration" on the south side of school.

Open Houses will be held on Tuesday, August 22, from 6:30-7:30PM for grades TK-6 in Boyden and grades 7-8 in Hull.

This is an excellent time for students to introduce themselves to their teachers, bring school supplies to their desk or locker, and see their new classrooms.

## **GREETINGS FROM SUPERINTENDENT GROND**

This is always a delicate newsletter. It seems like we just completed the previous school year and yet here we are putting together information for the upcoming school year. The buildings are clean and the floors are in the process of getting waxed, so we will be ready to get started on August 23.

## **BUILDING PROJECT**

We finished up the initial stages of looking at potential changes to our buildings with a review from approximately 30-35 community members in May. This group came to the board with a list of recommendations for the board to consider. Included in their top priorities were safety and secured entrances, ADA compliance at the elementary, and that the secondary was more in need of updates and expansion than the elementary. There were several other recommendations as well, including the elementary playground and additional custodial storage space at elementary. The board thanked them for their time and will continue to moving forward this fall with plans.

## **NEW TEACHERS**

We have completed most of our hiring and feel very good about the incoming group:

Nathan Alexander - Nathan was a mid-year hire last year after completing his coursework at the University of

Nebraska at Lincoln. Nathan will be teaching sixth grade again this year as well as being the varsity girls basketball coach.

Ashley Jasper - Ashley is a graduate of Morningside College. She will be teaching College Prep English, English 9, and 7th grade Reading this coming year in the JH and HS. In addition to her teaching, she will also be a JH Volleyball coach. Ashley and her husband have recently moved to Orange City as they split the difference between their work places.

Kent Zevenbergen - Kent is a graduate of Dordt College, a resident of Hull, and has previously taught at both Western Christian and Le Mars Gehlen. He will be teaching the Industrial Arts classes (2 sections) and Manufacturing II course at Boyden-Hull in the morning, and then transitioning to Sheldon for the afternoon.

Trevor Friedel - Trevor is a recent graduate of Morningside with a degree in History. He will be our ELL Teacher/Coordinator. Trevor's student teaching experience at Sioux City North and work with EL students has prepared him for this new position. He currently lives in the Paullina area, but will be moving to Hull at the beginning of August.

Toby Maggert - Toby is a graduate of the University of Northern Iowa. He grew up in Matlock and attended Sheldon CSD. Toby will be replacing Mrs. Bonestroo who graciously filled in last year, and will be teaching secondary math. He will also be the JV wrestling coach. We are excited to have a wrestling coach from

our district as we continue to build numbers and strength in the wrestling program.

Heidi Vanden Top - Heidi is a graduate of Northwestern College. She will be the SC Special Education teacher. She has served in a similar position as special education teacher for the CAM CSD. She has also served as a para-professional in the Sioux Center and Harrisburg School Districts in Special Education and holds an English/LA endorsement as well.

We are excited that each of these educators will either begin or continue their work in education at Boyden-Hull, and believe that they each bring outstanding credentials and abilities to our district. ### **JH OPEN HOUSE/7th GRADE/NEW STUDENT LAPTOP ROLL OUT**

On Tuesday, August 22<sup>nd</sup> from 6:30-7:30 pm, we invite all 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students, as well as any new students and their parents to come to the secondary building to view the school, meet their teachers and put their materials in the lockers. Following the Open House, we will be rolling out the Laptop computers to the 7<sup>th</sup> graders and new students to the district at 7:30 pm. Attendance by the student and one parent/guardian is required for the student to receive the laptop that evening.

### **8TH-12TH LAPTOP ROLL-OUT**

On August 15<sup>th</sup>, we will be distributing the laptops for grades 8<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade. We will be holding 4 sessions that are a half hour in length. We will again be going over a few house keeping and care items with the laptops. We do not need to set up the laptops as we have done the past two years, so this should speed up the process. We will begin each session promptly at the following times: 6:00PM, 6:30PM, 7:00PM, and 7:30PM. We ask that each student is accompanied by a parent or guardian. You can attend anyone of the 4 sessions. New students will receive their laptops on August 22<sup>nd</sup> at 7:30PM in the HS Commons.

### **OPENING DAY ASSEMBLY**

### **UPDATE FROM THE ELEMENTARY**

The summer continues to fly by quickly each year, especially if you have child involved in summer theatre, softball or baseball (Way to Go Nighthawks☺), 4-H activities, or many other summer opportunities for students. The school year will be starting later again this school year. We have Open House on Tuesday, August 22 starting at 6:30PM, and the first day of school on Wednesday, August 23. There are probably quite a few parents wishing that school would start tomorrow, which we often hear at registration time each year!

Many things that needed to be worked on throughout the summer months in preparation for the first day of school are completed or nearly finished. Some of these include: class lists, teaching schedules, curriculum orders, rooms cleaned and shampooed, hallways and gym floors waxed, and bus routes determined. This is only a small portion of our list that continues to expand each year. A special thank you to Daryl Egdorf, Ashley Madsen, and Steph Ochsendorf who help make the building look and operate like a billion dollars when school begins in August. The following are some of the changes in the elementary building for this upcoming year:

- A special thank you to the Brunsting Painting crew for a fresh coat of paint in the four classrooms in the kindergarten-first grade wing.
- New carpet was installed in the 6th grade classrooms in the beginning of July.
- The playground & new fencing will be expanded by the time school arrives in late August after the demolition of the Ross house & partial street closure on Blaine St.
- There will be a few new and familiar faces with different positions at the elementary building. Please

welcome Trevor Friedel who will be teaching TK-12 ELL in both buildings. Becky Ochsendorf is moving to teach 4th grade from 2nd grade. Melannie Hofmeyer is transitioning into Mr. Hoogeveen's P.E. position from K-12 Gifted & Talented. Cathryn Carney, former secondary science instructor, will be the new K-12 G/T teacher.

- It will be a little different to start the school year without seeing a familiar face in the office the past forty-two years with the retirement of Laura Van Meeteren. Pam Wielenga has been very busy being trained by Laura and myself this summer and at the end of last school year. Kathy Kleinwolterink will be taking Pam's paraprofessional position. Debbie Alexander is moving to an ELL position, and Becky Hansmann to a special education paraprofessional role in kindergarten.

### **PRESCHOOL START DATE**

The first day for the 2017-18 Boyden-Hull Preschool will be on Thursday, September 7, 2017. Mrs. Annie Van Der Zwaag will be contacting you in August to arrange a required home visit prior to preschool start date.

### **TITLE I READING**

Title I reading instruction at Boyden-Hull Elementary is usually done with students in grades K-4. Students are given instruction in small-group settings based on the student's needs as determined by the classroom teacher and testing that is done within our school. We use the IA Assessments and AIMSweb test results to help determine a student's eligibility.

Students who demonstrate the need for reading instruction are then grouped by skills and age. All of our Title I teachers are assigned to these small groups to teach reading skills needed by students. These are fully certified teachers with all the necessary reading endorsements required by state and federal law. If you have any questions about the Title I program, please visit with one of the Title I teachers or Mr. Kerr, the elementary principal, during our Open House on Tuesday, August 22, 2017, from 6:30-7:30 P.M.

## **SCHOOL PICTURES**

School pictures will be taken on Tuesday, September 26th. Your child will be given an envelope with information about ordering school pictures a week or so prior to this date. Pictures will begin right away in the morning at the Elementary, and around noon at the Jr/Sr High School. Students will hand their envelopes directly to the photographer at the time of their picture. Even if a student or family decides not to purchase the pictures, they will need to take the picture for the annual Yearbook.

## **SCHOOL SUPPLIES**

*Supply lists will be in the registration packets.*

Backpacks and P.E. bags need to fit in a locker without causing damage to the locker's latch and hinges. Repair for damage to a locker is the responsibility of the student assigned to that locker. Students will need book covers for many of their courses. It seems like at the start of the year, many of the retail stores run out of the commercial book covers. I would encourage students to "Think Green" and use a brown paper bag from the grocery store. Another useful item for students is an accordion folder to help keep their papers and other materials organized. We will be providing the JH students with a daily planner. We would also encourage students to use the Google Calendar and Stickies on their laptops for their calendars. Students can share their Google Calendars with their parents so parents know when assignments, projects, and other test and quizzes are planned.

## **ATHLETIC BOOSTER CLUB**

The Athletic Boosters will have Comet & Nighthawk items available, forms for Comet Volleyball and Nighthawk Football order-only apparel, and sale items available during registration in Hull on Aug 8-9, and in Boyden during the Elementary Open House on Aug 22.

## **HEALTH-RELATED REQUIREMENTS**

Students in all grades need to have the required immunizations before the first day of school. Please check with your health care provider to make sure that your child has had the immunizations and tests needed for school. The school is required to have a copy of your child's current immunization record on file.

Pre-K, Kdg, & TK students are required to have all immunizations per age prior to beginning school. **New requirements have been made for 7th and 11th grade students.**

A Health Physical is required for Preschool age students. Your Physician must complete the form, and you should return the forms to the school as soon as possible.

A dental exam is required for 9th grade and Kdg students. For 9th graders, a screening completed within one year prior to enrollment is acceptable. For Kdg. students, a screening done between ages 3 to 6 is acceptable.

A vision screen is required by the State of Iowa for all students in Kdg & 3rd grade. Completed forms need to be returned to the school office as soon as possible.

Athletic physicals are required for students who participate in school-sponsored sports (including cheer & dance). If your child had a physical over the summer months, please send a copy to the school nurse. Physicals are good for one year. Your child will not be allowed to attend practice until a physical is on file at school.

## **JR/SR HIGH T.A.G. PROGRAM**

The assessment process for the G/T program involves several factors. Some of the tools used are the AIMSweb test, the Iowa Assessment Test, and the Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) test. Most students admitted into the program will score in the 95<sup>th</sup> percentile or better on their composite score or in a particular subject area. For instance, we already have in place an accelerated program in our math curriculum. We will be making efforts to add more modifications to our courses of study to better challenge our highly motivated students. These modifications may be in

the form of special projects or research with the help of volunteer mentors. Some of our students have taken concurrent enrollment courses via online or PSEO (Courses at Dordt College or Northwestern College). Standardized test scores are just one means of measuring a student's inclusion in the Talented and Gifted Program.

Teacher recommendations will also be considered. Often times teachers will recognize students who have an exceptional interest or ability in a particular subject area. Efforts will be made to foster that student's knowledge beyond regular classroom work. These recommendations will be factored in with other qualifications for the program.

Students may also request participation in the program. A highly motivated student willing to work beyond the required classroom levels is surely a candidate for this program. Usually in these cases, a performance test is given to assess the level of the student's ability. A final decision on being in the program will be made by an appointed faculty committee. This part of the program could lead to enhancements of the classroom requirements.

Gifted and talented opportunities are available in general intellectual, specific academic, creativity, leadership, or visual and performing arts areas. This is why we would like students interested in the program to fill out the information form as a spring-board for our efforts to get the program started as soon as possible in the fall.

Giftedness has many faces. The Boyden-Hull School District recognizes the need to provide all students with opportunities and experiences that will allow them to reach their full potential. If you have any questions about this program, please contact Ms. Carney or Mr. Pottebaum.

### **OPTIONAL STUDENT INSURANCE**

Optional student accident insurance will be available. There are separate coverage plans for at-school, field trip, 24-hour, and high school football. The insurance provider is Markel Insurance. You will enroll using their website: <http://markel.sevencorners.com>. The secure website provides information on the various coverage and premium options, answers of frequently asked questions, and allows you to purchase the insurance using a credit/debit card. If you have questions or need help filing a claim, contact Koele Insurance (439-1122). Additional information will be available at registration.

As you decide whether or not to purchase this plan, please keep in mind that the school's liability insurance plan has a specific exclusion regarding medical payments for student injuries.

### **SCHOOL MESSENGER**

Last year, the district started using the SchoolMessenger notification system for weather notices. Please note that any phone number or email addresses that you provide to include in your child's JMC account will carry over into the SchoolMessenger contact database. If there are phone numbers or email addresses you'd like to have in JMC, but not in SchoolMessenger or if you have a preference on how you'd like to receive these messages, you may go to <https://contactme.schoolmessenger.com/?u=boydenhull>, contact the district office for the ID number of your child(ren), and customize your preferences on receiving the messages. If you need any help with this process,

please contact Julie Johnson in the District Office.

Around the time we started using the SchoolMessenger program, the legislature passed a law limiting services such as this from contacting mobile numbers without permission. The purpose of this law is to prevent unknown and uncontrollable data charges that your phone/plan may not be set up for. In order to receive announcements on your cell phone, please text 'Yes' to 67587. You should receive a confirmation message explaining that your mobile number is now enrolled in emergency messages for Boyden-Hull Community Schools.

### **OPEN ENROLLMENT OPTION**

Parents/guardians considering open enrollment for their child(ren) into another school district in Iowa need to be aware of the following deadlines for filing the required paperwork.

- March 1, 2017 -was the last date for regular open enrollment requests for the 2017-18 school year.
- September 1, 2017 is the deadline for incoming kindergarten students only.

- Enrollment deadlines for the 2018-19 school year are March 1, 2018 for regular open enrollment requests and September 1, 2018 for incoming kindergarteners.

Applications received after these deadlines will not be approved unless the reason for late filing qualifies for "good cause." There are a number of state-approved reasons that qualify for "good cause," including moving to a new district and change in the parents' marital status.

Transportation assistance may be available for parents/guardians of open enrolled students who meet the eligibility guidelines. This may be actual transportation or a cash stipend at the resident district's discretion.

Families also need to know that open enrollment may result in the loss of athletic eligibility.

Contact the Superintendent's Office if you have questions or need an open enrollment form.

## JR. HIGH FOOTBALL



JH Nighthawk football practice begins on Monday, Aug 21 at 4:00PM in Hull.

Buses will leave from Rock Valley School & Boyden Elementary School at 3:45PM for the first practice.

On Wednesday, August 23, students begin classes and will dismiss at 2:25. Practice will begin at 4:00 and we will try and get the 7th grade concussion baseline testing done that day in addition to practicing. For the remainder of the season, practice will be held after school and is usually done around 5:30. Buses return Rock Valley and Boyden players to their respective towns at approximately 6:00 pm.

All athletes must have a current completed physical form on file in their respective offices before they may practice.
