REGISTRATION

Registration materials will be mailed to each family. **It is important that you fill out the forms and bring the completed forms with you to registration on**

August 6 or 7. By completing the forms before you come for registration, we hope to make things run more smoothly and quickly for you. It is important to register your child(ren) before the school year begins. *If you are new to the district or registering a student in kindergarten, please bring your child's birth certificate & immunization records.*

The 2018-19 School Registration will be held on **Monday, August 6th from 10AM – 6PM in Hull** and **Tuesday, August 7th from 10AM – 6PM at the Boyden Elementary & the Hull JH/HS.** Due to the construction, we will be holding the **JHHS School Registration** in the **HS Library** and **Elementary Registration in the Art Room.** We ask that everyone enter the Gym/Theater Doors. On Tuesday, August 7th, registration will be held in the Elementary office in Boyden for grades PK-6, and in the JHHS library in Hull for grades 7-12.

We will be offering to families the opportunity to register through the JMC Online Registration process. In the registration packets, you will find directions for the Online Registration process. We will also e-mail these directions in a pdf format on July 31st. Please follow these directions and if you have questions, e-mail or call your respective building administrator or administrative assistant. We have uploaded all of the forms that you would need to return if you were to choose this option. These forms need to be returned either electronically or by dropping off during the registration days. You may also choose to complete the forms and simply come in and pay your registration fees if you are not comfortable using PaySchools. We will also have a few stations set up in the JH/HS Commons on Monday, August 6th if you would like to come in and complete the Online Registration process with assistance. We will have the Online Registration open through

JMC from Wednesday, August 1st to Friday, August 10th.

We have scheduled the registration during the second week in August as the Fall Sports (Football, Volleyball, & Cross Country) practices begin on August 6th. Please contact your coach for the exact dates and times that these practices will begin. **A reminder that all Fall athletes need to have a current Athletic Physical and Concussion Form on file with the school nurse before they are able to start official practice.** Please try and make it to one of these two days for registration as it helps our secretaries get all finer details such as lockers, sections, and other last minute changes taken care of before the first day of school. Mr. Francis will also be available during registration for your student to come in and make any schedule changes prior to the start of the 2018-19 school year. GREETINGS FROM SUPERINTENDENT GROND

It’s my annual “hard to believe that we are talking about starting school again” newsletter write-up. This summer seemed to go faster than most due to the events happening at the school surrounding construction. However, it is still a good thing when we are getting closer to school and having the teachers and students back.

CONSTRUCTION NEWS

Construction started around the end of May with Hoogendoorn Construction getting organized on site. The girls' locker rooms on the SW corner have been demolished, and the NE section will be next to be cleaned out. We are

hoping that we will see some structure going up shortly. It is still the plan to be done with Phase I around July 1st of next year. Phase II of the project, which deals more with the renovations will go out to bid later in this year to start work next spring. As we progress with the project, there will be somewhat of an industrial look and feel to the building with cement floors where floor tile has been, changing ceilings and removing drop ceilings, displaced classrooms, dust, and extra noise. We ask that you bear with us as the work continues. We are hopeful that we will be put back together by the fall of 2020!

LEVY RATE FOR FY’19

When the board and administration were discussing the new building project, the cost of the project and the impact it would have on the overall levy rate were important topics of conversation. We worked very hard to make the cost and payments manageable. We felt that we could add 11 million dollars in additions and renovations while keeping the levy rate close to where the average has been for the past ten years. The average over the past ten years is \$14.457. This year's current levy rate is \$14.594. Below is a comparison of last year’s rate to this year’s overall levy rate.

UPDATE FROM THE JR/SR HIGH

SCHOOL Dan Pottebaum, Principal **Welcome Back Students & Staff!**

The Summer of 2018 has been exciting. The initial stages of the new additions to the Band/Vocal Areas have begun as well as the preliminary work for the new Industrial Arts & Agricultural areas in the NE corner. As the school year wrapped up, we began the domino effect of classrooms and offices moving around due to the 3 classrooms in the NE corner not being available to be used during the 2018-19 year for these renovations. The Special Education classroom in the NE corner of the building will be using the old ICN classroom for this school year. The ELL classroom that was on the old stage will move into the At-Risk/Alternative HS Classroom in the JH Hallway. The At-Risk/Alternative HS classes will share the HS Special Education classroom for the 2018-19 school year. The Teacher Leaders of Mrs. Draayer, Mrs. Visscher, and Ms. Friedrichsen will have their offices temporarily in the music retention room next to the HS Board Room.

In addition, during the 2018-19 school year, we have designated the JH Boys Locker Room as the JH/HS Girls Locker Room. Another change that will take place in the schedule this year will be for Mr. Montgomery and his courses. Last year, he taught his classes in the morning and transitioned to Sheldon in the afternoon. In the 2018-19 school year, his courses will be offered in the afternoon at Boyden-Hull so we can maximize the availability of the Art classroom for either Agriculture or Industrial Arts courses. Over the next couple of years, we will have several changes and inconveniences due to the construction and re-modeling project. We will need to be patient and work through these challenges as we approach them and remind ourselves of the finished product in the 2020-21 school year.

As we turn the page to the 2018-19 school year, students and community members will see some new faces in the JH/HS building, and some familiar faces filling new roles. We are excited to welcome Mr. Isaiah Richter, and Ms. Emily Laackman into their new teaching

roles. As we are in the midst of the summer, we have a couple of part-time positions that we are still trying to fill. The 8th grade math position will be filled by Ms. Friedrichsen and the JH/HS Gifted and Talented position will be filled by Mrs. Godtland for the first half of the year. We will be looking and hope to find an excellent teaching candidate that would be willing to fill both the math position and G/T position for the 2nd semester of this year.

JH OPEN HOUSE/7th GRADE/NEW STUDENT LAPTOP ROLL OUT

On Tuesday, August 21 from 6:30-7:30PM, we invite all 7th and 8th grade students and their parents to come to the secondary building to meet their teachers and put their materials in the lockers. Following the Open House, we will be rolling out the Laptop computers to the 7th graders and New students to the district at 7:30PM. Attendance by the student and one parent/guardian is required for the student to receive the laptop that evening.

8TH-12TH LAPTOP ROLL-OUT

On Tuesday, August 14th, we will be distributing the laptops for grades 8th-12th grade. We will be holding 4 sessions that are each a half hour in length. We will again be going over a few housekeeping and care items with the laptops. However, we do not need to set up the laptops as we have done in years past. This should speed up the process. We will begin each session promptly at the following times: 6:00PM, 6:30PM, 7:00PM, and 7:30PM. We ask that each student be accompanied by a parent or guardian. You can attend any one of the four sessions. New students will receive their laptops on August 21 at 7:30PM in the HS Commons.

OPENING DAY ASSEMBLY

Parents are invited to attend the Jr/ Sr High Assembly on August 23rd at 8:30AM in the B-H HS Theatre. All students in grades 7-12 and faculty members will attend this assembly. At the assembly, Mr. Pottebaum will convey the yearly expectations to the students and go over the changes to the Student Handbook.

UPDATE FROM THE ELEMENTARY

The summer continues to fly by quickly each year, especially if you have child involved in summer theatre, softball or baseball, 4-H activities, or many other summer opportunities for students. The school year will be starting later in the week again this year pending any construction obstacles at the secondary building. We have Open House on Tuesday, August 21 starting at 6:30PM and the first day of school on Thursday, August 23. There are probably quite a few parents wishing that school would start tomorrow, which we often hear at registration time each year!

Many things that need to be worked on throughout the summer months in preparation for the first day of school are completed or nearly finished. Some of these include: class lists, teaching schedules, curriculum orders, rooms cleaned and shampooed, hallways and gym floors waxed, and bus routes determined. This is only a small portion of our list that continues to expand each year. A special thank you to Daryl Egdorf, Ashley Madsen, and Steph Ochsendorf who help make the building look and operate like a billion dollars when school begins in August. The following are some of the changes in the elementary building for this upcoming 2018-19 school year:

- A special thank you goes to the Brunsting Painting crew for a fresh coat of paint in the 3rd and 4th grade classrooms.
- New carpet was installed in the 3rd grade classrooms at the end of June.
- There is extra green playground space for students, along with new fencing on the former Ross property. New playground and soccer balls were ordered, along with a bundle of sturdy jump ropes too!
- Please welcome a new and familiar face at the elementary building. Megan Alexander has been hired for the extra morning preschool section. She will be in charge of the elementary gifted and talented program in the afternoons for Ms. Carney. Ms. Carney is pursuing an advanced degree at the University of Iowa.

- It will be a little different to start the school year without seeing a familiar face with Debbie Alexander staying home to watch Nathan and Megan's new baby, and being a proud grandparent! Becky Hansmann is going to move back to the ELL position she held in previous years to replace Debbie's duties.

PRESCHOOL START DATE

The first day for the 2018-19 Boyden-Hull Preschool will be on Thursday, September 6, 2018. Mrs. Annie Van Der Zwaag and Mrs. Megan Alexander will be contacting you in August to arrange a required home visit prior to the preschool start date.

TITLE I READING

Title I reading instruction at Boyden-Hull Elementary is usually done with students in grades K-4. Students are given instruction in small-group settings based on the student's needs as determined by the classroom teacher and testing that is done within our school. We use the IA Assessments and AIMSweb Pus test results to help determine a student's eligibility.

Students who demonstrate the need for reading instruction will be grouped by skills and age. All of our Title I teachers are assigned to these small groups to teach reading skills needed by students. These are fully certified teachers with all the necessary reading endorsements required by state and federal law. If you have any questions about the Title I program, please visit with one of the Title I teachers or Mr. Kerr, the elementary principal, during our Open House on Tuesday, August 21, 2018, from 6:30-7:30PM

SCHOOL PICTURES

School pictures will be taken on Tuesday, September 18th. Your child will be given an envelope with information about ordering school pictures a week or so prior to this date. Pictures will begin right away in the morning at the Elementary, and around noon at the Jr/Sr High School. Students will hand their envelopes directly to the photographer at the time of their picture. Even if a student or family decides not to purchase the pictures,

they will need to take the picture for the annual Yearbook.

I would also remind seniors to give Mrs. Hibma a senior picture as soon as possible along with a baby picture. It seems every year we are scrambling for a few students to turn these pictures in for the Yearbook and the Senior Video.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES

Supply lists will be in the registration packets.

Backpacks and P.E. bags need to fit in a locker without causing damage to the locker's latch and hinges. Repair for damage to a locker is the responsibility of the student assigned to that locker. Students will need book covers for many of their courses. It seems like at the start of the year, many of the retail stores run out of the commercial book covers. I would encourage students to "Think Green" and use a brown paper bag from the grocery store. Another useful item for students is an accordion folder to help keep their papers and other materials organized. We will be providing the JH students with a daily planner. We would also encourage students to use the Google Calendar and Stickies on their laptops for their calendars. Students can share their Google Calendars with their parents so parents know when assignments, projects, and other test and quizzes are planned.

ATHLETIC BOOSTER CLUB

The Athletic Boosters will have Comet & Nighthawk items available, forms for Comet Volleyball and Nighthawk Football order-only apparel, and sale items available during registration in Hull on Aug 6-7, and in Boyden during the Elementary Open House on Aug 21.

HEALTH-RELATED REQUIREMENTS

Students in all grades need to have the required immunizations before the first day of school. Please check with your health care provider to make sure that your child has had the immunizations and tests needed for school. The school is required to have a copy of your child's current immunization record on file. Pre-K, Kdg, & TK students are required to have all immunizations per age prior to beginning school. **New requirements have been made for 7th and 11th grade students.**

A Health Physical is required for Preschool age students. Your Physician

must complete the form, and you should return the forms to the school as soon as possible.

A dental exam is required for 9th grade and Kdg students. For 9th graders, a screening completed within one year prior to enrollment is acceptable. For Kdg. students, a screening done between ages 3 to 6 is acceptable.

A vision screen is required by the State of Iowa for all students in Kdg & 3rd grade. Completed forms need to be returned to the school office as soon as possible.

Athletic physicals are required for students who participate in school-sponsored sports (including cheer & dance). If your child had a physical over the summer months, please send a copy to the school nurse. Physicals are good for one year. Your child will not be allowed to attend practice until a physical is on file at school.

JR/SR HIGH T.A.G. PROGRAM

The assessment process for G/T program involves several factors. Some of the tools used are the Iowa Assessment Test, Measures of Academic Progress (MAP), and AIMSweb test. Most students admitted into the program will score in the 95th percentile or better on their composite score or in a particular subject area. For instance, we already have in place an accelerated program in our math curriculum. We will be making efforts to add more modifications to our courses of study to better challenge our highly motivated students. These modifications may be in the form of special projects or research with the help of volunteer mentors. Some of our students have taken concurrent enrollment courses online or PSEO (Courses at Northwestern College or Dordt College). Standardized test scores are just one means of measuring a

student's inclusion in the Talented and Gifted Program.

Often teachers will recognize students who have an exceptional interest or ability in a particular subject area. Efforts will be made to foster that student's knowledge beyond the regular classroom work. These teacher recommendations will be factored in with other qualifications for the program.

Students may also request participation in the program. A highly motivated student willing to work beyond the required classroom levels is surely a candidate for this program. Usually in these cases a performance test is given to assess the level of the student's ability. A final decision on being in the program will be made by an appointed faculty committee. This part of the program could lead to enhancements of the classroom requirements.

Gifted and talented opportunities are available in general intellectual, specific academic, creativity, leadership, or visual and performing arts areas. This is why we would like students interested in the program to fill out the information form as a spring-board for our efforts to get the program started as soon as possible in the fall.

Giftedness has many faces. The Boyden-Hull School District recognizes the need to provide all students with opportunities and experiences that will allow them to reach their full potential. If you have any questions about this program, please contact Mrs. Godtland or Mr. Pottebaum.

OPTIONAL STUDENT INSURANCE

Optional student accident insurance will be available. There are separate coverage plans for at-school, field trip, 24-hour, and high school football. The insurance provider is Markel Insurance. You will enroll using their website: <http://markel.sevencorners.com>. The secure website provides information on the various coverage and premium options, answers of frequently asked questions, and allows you to purchase the insurance using a credit/debit card. If you have questions or need help filing a claim, contact Koele Insurance (439-1122). Additional information will be available at registration.

As you decide whether or not to purchase this plan, please keep in mind that the school's liability insurance plan has a specific exclusion regarding medical payments for student injuries.

SCHOOL MESSENGER

For the past few years, the district has been using the SchoolMessenger notification system for weather notices. Please note that any phone number or email addresses that you provide to include in your child's JMC account will carry over into the SchoolMessenger contact database. If you have a preference on how you'd like to receive these messages, you may go to <https://contactme.schoolmessenger.com/?u=boydenhull>, and contact the district office for the ID number of your child(ren). If you need any help with this process, please contact Julie Johnson in the District Office.

Around the time we started using the SchoolMessenger program, the legislature passed a law limiting services such as this from contacting mobile numbers without permission. The purpose of this law is to prevent unknown and uncontrollable data charges that your phone/plan may not be set up for. In order to receive announcements on your cell phone, please text 'Yes' to 67587. You should receive a confirmation message explaining that your mobile number is enrolled in emergency messages for Boyden-Hull Community Schools.

KIDS CLUB

Kids' Club is a fun, safe, nurturing environment for kids in grades K-3rd. The program is community and church supported so all kids are welcome for free! It's a great opportunity for kids to spend time with each other, volunteers, and Jesus Christ. The program begins after Labor Day on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:30PM to 5:30PM, ending the 1st week in May. Complete the kids club worksheet included in the packet if you would like your child to attend or volunteer.

OPEN ENROLLMENT OPTION

Parents/guardians considering open enrollment for their child(ren) into another school district in Iowa need to be aware of the following deadlines for filing the required paperwork.

- March 1, 2018 -was the last date for regular open enrollment requests for the 2018-19 school year.
- September 1, 2018 is the deadline for incoming kindergarten students only.
- Enrollment deadlines for the 2019-20 school year are March 1, 2019 for regular open enrollment requests and September 1, 2019 for incoming kindergarteners.

Applications received after these deadlines will not be approved unless the reason for late filing qualifies for "good cause." There are a number of state-approved reasons that qualify for "good cause," including moving to a new district and change in the parents' marital status.

Transportation assistance may be available for parents/guardians of open enrolled students who meet the eligibility guidelines. This may be actual transportation or a cash stipend at the resident district's discretion.

Families also need to know that open enrollment may result in the loss of athletic eligibility.

Contact the Superintendent's Office if you have questions or need an open enrollment form.

JR. HIGH FOOTBALL

JH Nighthawk football practice begins on
