## GREETINGS FROM SUPERINTENDENT GROND!

Welcome to May ~

We are closing in on graduation and the end of the school year is approaching. There are numerous items that I want to update you about with events going on at Boyden-Hull both this spring

## Building Project

We are nearing completion of the band/vocal area, and it should be completed by mid to late May. This portion of the project is approximately six weeks ahead of schedule, and it is looking great. The carpet is getting put down, they set the cabinets in place last week, and we are hoping to move equipment into the area around May 20th. The shop area is coming along as well and is on schedule to be completed by July 1st. The second phase of our current construction project will begin on May 1st. This upcoming phase will be more problematic as it is more remodeling and will require more patience as they will be working in closer proximity to teachers and students. So far the project has gone very smoothly, and we are expecting that to continue.

## School Budget

We certified the school budget on April 15. When we were looking at the building project, we estimated that we believed that we would be within 15 - 20 cents of our average levy rate over the past ten years. The average levy rate for the past ten years has been \$14.48/\$1,000 of valuation. The first year of the bond the rate rose to \$14.59. The upcoming year we certified at \$14.57. The breakdown of the levy rates is in the table shown below:

### OPERATING LEVY

This money is used to support the general fund which pays for the daily operations of the school.

### MANAGEMENT LEVY

This levy has two main purposes - building liability insurance and early-retirement funding.

### PPEL (Physical Plant and Equipment Levy)

There are two components to this levy. One is the board-approved levy, which is \$0.33, and the other is the voter-approved levy, which can be up to \$1.34. We use these funds for both infrastructure and capital purchases such as buses. These can include building improvements or renovations such as roof replacements or additions, buses and other vehicles and

computers. This levy needs to be voted on every ten years and will next expire in 2026.

### DEBT SERVICE

This levy used to pay off our general obligation bond which was for the building project in that was started last year.

### OVERALL LEVY RATE

Once again, we are anticipating that our overall levy rate will be at \$14.48/\$1,000 of taxable valuation this year. The table below shows the breakdown of levy rates over the past seven years and the projected rate for 2018.

### 2019 - 2020 School Calendar

We are looking at some different options for the calendar coming up for the 2019 - 2020 school year. We have some items that have caused to look at our calendar a little differently this year including the construction project, the state-mandated start date on August 23rd, which is a Friday, and Memorial Day which is early. We will be adding ten minutes to each school day - five at the beginning and five at the end of the day. So this upcoming school year we will start the day at 8:15 and end at 3:30. We are also looking to begin on August 27 or 28 and finish on May 21. We are also looking at adding some alternatives to snow days coming up as well. More information and a complete calendar will be available after the May Board Meeting.

# ELEMENTARY NEWS

## Open Enrollment Option

Parents/guardians considering open enrollment for their child(ren) into another school district in Iowa need to be aware of the following deadlines for filing the required paperwork.

March 1, 2019 - This is the last date for regular open enrollment requests for the 2019-20 school year. For incoming kindergarten students, the deadline is September 1, 2019.

Applications received after these deadlines will not be approved unless the reason for late filing qualifies for "good cause." There are a number of state-approved reasons that qualify for "good cause," including moving to a new district and change in the parents' marital status.

Transportation Assistance - Parents are responsible for transporting children open enrolled to another district. This applies to all students including those with an IEP. If the need for transportation as a related service is stated in the IEP, as a general rule the parent is responsible for this obligation under open enrollment. If a child open enrolls to a district that is contiguous (borders) to the home district, and the parents' income meets economic eligibility requirements, the family may receive a stipend for transportation or be provided transportation by the district. Income verification must be provided to the resident district.

Students that open enroll in grades 9 through 12, shall not be eligible to participate in varsity contests and competitions during the first 90 school days of transfer. Please contact the Iowa Girls High School Athletic Union at (515) 288-9741 or the Iowa High School Athletic Association at (515) 432-2011 for questions regarding eligibility.

## Laptop Check In:

As we head down the final weeks of school, we will begin the preparation for the collection of the MacBook Aires the 7th-12th grade students were issued at the beginning of the school year. We encourage students to save any materials that they want to save off their laptop to their Google Drive. Each of the students laptops will be inspected and examined for damages as they are returned. In preparation, please help your child and check the following:

1. Check for loose or missing screws on the bottoms of the laptop.

4. Any other abnormalities or damages that need to be addressed during the summer months.
5. Does the Asset TAG on the Laptop and Charger the same?
6. Do you have your duckbill (little attached that has the flip out prongs to plug into the outlet)?

If your child has any of the issues listed above, please have them stop in and visit with Mr. Kuecker as soon as possible to resolve these issues. This will eliminate a lot of headaches as we take inventory of the computers on Thursday, May 23 and Friday, May 24. Your attention to these issues prior to the check in the last few days of school will save your child a lot of time during the check in process. We would also encourage cleaning the laptop using the microfiber cloth in each of the classrooms. A easy and quick way to clean your child's laptop bottom is a "magic eraser." Please have your child shut down their laptop prior to cleaning the screen, keyboard, and bottom of their laptop.

If your child has had any laptop damages that fines were assessed as a result of their care, the payment or plan for payment needs to be established before the student will be allowed to check out for the summer.

## DRIVER'S EDUCATION REMINDER:

The final registration papers for this Summer's Drivers Education Program have been mailed out this week. These registration papers and payment need to be returned by Friday, May 17th. The Drivers Education course will run the following dates:

Tuesday, June 4th and Friday, June 7th  
Monday, June 10th and Thursday, June 13th  
Monday, June 17th and Tuesday June 18th

All courses will run from 8 am - 11 am in the Art Room at the Boyden-Hull JH/HS. Students will need to enter through the middle doors on the north side of the building on 2nd Street due to construction. We will provide a shuttle bus to Hull from the Boyden Elementary that will leave Boyden at 7:45 a.m. and return students at the conclusion of the class at 11 a.m. All students are required to complete the 30 hours of the classroom instruction. Students are allowed one absence before they are dropped from the course. If they happen to miss a class due to an excused absence (bereavement or illness), the student is required to make up that time on a make-up day established by the instructor. In addition to the classroom instruction, students are required 6 hours behind the wheel and equal to or more hours of observation while another student is driving. The instructor will plan the driving schedule with your child on the first day of the class. In addition, we ask that your child brings a pen or pencil and a notebook with them to the first day of class. If you have any additional questions, please feel free to call the school.

## LUNCH BALANCE REMINDERS

PLEASE take care of any negative lunch balances as soon as possible. Students will not be allowed to check out at the end of the school year until their negative lunch balance is paid. E-mail reminders are sent out daily of low or negative lunch balances. Students also receive paper reminders in their lockers. Please speak to your son or daughter about their lunch balance as we approach the end of the school year. You can estimate your cost

by multiplying the number of days left in the school year with the cost of \$2.90 per meal. This will give you an estimate as we wind down the school year.

Also, as the year ends, we often do not refund balances because of the accuracy of the program. Balances will be able to roll over into next year's account for you. We therefore, we will not refund lunch money at the end of the year unless the student is in the exit grade of the building they attend. This means only 6th graders and seniors will have their lunch money refunded to them at the end of the year. All others will have the balances in their accounts rolled over into their lunch accounts for next year. If you have any questions about this, contact your respective building Principal.

## STUDENT COUNCIL BLOOD DRIVE:

The Boyden-Hull Student Council will be hosting a blood drive for the Life Serve Blood Center out of Sioux City. This event will occur on Friday, May 10<sup>th</sup> from 8:30 a.m. - 1:30 p.m. Community members are welcome to sign up in the office in the week prior to this event. The Student Council will also be hosting a breakfast in which Donuts, Belgium Waffles, milk and juice will be served for \$3 per person.

This event encourages students to eat a healthy breakfast on the day of the Blood Drive. We also want to remind students to drink plenty of fluids 24-28 hours prior to their donation. We do require that a parent sign a permission slip in order for students to give blood for students who are 16 & 17 years of age. There is an age & weight requirement to meet to qualify as a potential donor. Seniors that have donated a minimum of 5 times during their high school years will be honored

at the Commencement Ceremony on May 19<sup>th</sup> and will also have a red chord that they will wear to recognize them as a “Donor of Distinction.

Remember that donating blood is a gift of life.

## SEMESTER EXAMS – FINAL REPORT CARDS:

The high school students will have a special semester test schedule on Thursday, May 23 and Friday, May 24.

This also means there will be open campus for them. The high school students only have to be in school when they have tests. The library will be supervised as a study area for those students who wish to use it. We do recommend that all students stay in school until they have finished their last test of the day. Any undue “cruising” around town will cause open campus to be immediately terminated.

**ALL STUDENTS IN GRADES 9-11 MAY NEED TO TAKE THE SEMESTER EXAMS IN ALL CLASSES except G/T & PE. THE SCHOOL EXPECTS NO ABSENCES DURING THE TEST DAYS UNLESS EXCUSED BY THE PRINCIPAL beforehand!** There is little time available for getting makeup work done at this point in the year.

The junior high will NOT have semester tests and their class schedule will be pretty routine. They will be going on their annual trip to Newton Hills on Friday, May 31<sup>st</sup>. A JH student may not have this opportunity IF all other academic, discipline, and attendance requirements have been met by the students. These requirements include finishing up all work that is due, serving all detention time that has been assigned, turning in all school materials, and meeting the behavior/discipline code as set by the school administration.

AGAIN-The junior high DOES NOT have open campus the last two days of

school. They must attend the full day of school each day as well as attend any final day activities that are scheduled. Friday, May 31<sup>st</sup> is the last day of school for grades 7-11.

The final REPORT CARDS, for the year, will tentatively be ready on, or about, June 3<sup>rd</sup>. We will be e-mailing the report cards out for the summer. If you do not have an e-mail address, we will mail the report card.

## MAY TERM AND JH MINI COURSES:

The 9<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup> grade students will be participating in May Term Courses on Tuesday, May 28<sup>th</sup> through Friday, May 31<sup>st</sup>. We will be having a 5 period block schedule on those 4 days where students have signed up for their May Term Courses. Each day, they will have 5 classes that will give them an opportunity to try a course they have not had during their normal class schedule. The JH students will also be having Mini-courses on Tuesday, Wednesday, and the first half of Thursday. They will be turning in their laptops and going through the check out process in the afternoon on Thursday. The JH students will be rotating through their mini-courses whereas the high school students selected there courses they will be taking during these 4 days. The JH students will be attending the Newton Hills Trip on Friday, May 31<sup>st</sup> if they have completed all their necessary work.

## BH JH & HS BANDS AT MEMORIAL DAY:

Our High School and Junior High Band members will be participating in the Memorial Day Cemetery programs on Monday, May 27<sup>th</sup>. We usually are involved in 5-6 memorial programs on that day. Because of the need for all Band members in both the junior high and high school bands, we ask that family travel plans or family outings be postponed until after the programs that day. It should go without saying

that we cannot do this community service if our band students do not attend! We ask that parents help us fulfill our responsibilities that day! WE WANT TO HONOR THOSE WHO HAVE GONE BEFORE US, AND THOSE WHO HAVE DEFENDED THE FREEDOMS WE ENJOY DAILY!
