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REGISTRATION

Registration materials will be mailed to each family. **It is important that you fill out the forms and bring the completed forms with you to registration on August 7 or 8.** By completing the forms before you come for registration, we hope to make things run more smoothly and quickly for you. It is important to register your child(ren) before the school year begins. *If you are new to the district or registering a student in kindergarten, please bring your child's birth certificate & immunization records.*

The 2019-20 School Registration will be held on **Wednesday, August 7th from 10AM-6PM in Hull and Thursday, August 8th from 10AM-6PM at the Boyden Elementary & the Hull JH/HS.** Due to the construction, we will be holding the **JHHS School Registration** in the **HS Library and Elementary Registration in the Art Room.** We ask that everyone enter through the Gym/Theater Doors. On Thursday, August 8th, registration will be held in the Elementary office in Boyden for grades PK-6, and in the JHHS library in Hull for grades 7-12.

We will be offering families the opportunity to register through the JMC Online Registration process. In the registration packets, you will find directions for this process. We will also e-mail these directions in a pdf format in July. Please follow these directions and if you have questions, e-mail or call your respective building administrator or administrative assistant. We have uploaded all of the forms that you would need to return if you were to choose this option. These forms need to be returned either electronically or by dropping off during the registration days. You may also choose to complete the forms and simply come in and pay your registration fees if you are not comfortable using PaySchools. We will also have a few stations set up in the

JH/HS Commons on Wednesday, August 7th if you would like to come in and complete the Online Registration process with assistance. We will have the Online Registration open from Thursday, August 1st to Friday, August 9th.

We have scheduled registration during the second week in August as the Fall Sports (Football, Volleyball, & Cross Country) practices begin on August 12th. Please contact your coach for the exact dates and times that these practices will begin. A reminder that all Fall athletes need to have a current Athletic Physical and Concussion Form on file with the school nurse before they are able to start official practice. Please try and make it to one of these two days for registration as it helps our secretaries get all finer details such as lockers, sections, and other last minute changes taken care of before the first day of school. Mr. Francis will also be available during Registration Days for your student to come in and make any schedule changes prior to the start of the 2019-20 school year. GREETINGS FROM SUPERINTENDENT GROND

There are some changes ahead for the start of the school year:

THE BUILDING PROJECT

Obviously one of the big changes is the building project. In the junior high / high school, we will open the new band & vocal area on the southwest corner and the new classrooms and shop areas

in the northwest corner. The renovation of the secondary offices is also underway. Most summers we feel uncertain if the buildings will be ready for school since we do deep cleaning, reorganizing, and the like. This year, we have more uncertainty than usual! Rooms are being renovated, and there is still quite a bit of work to be done. The good news is that we still have a month, but the bad news is that teachers may not have much time to get their rooms ready.

The work at the elementary school is progressing well, and we should be ready for the start of the school year. In the secondary building, work will continue throughout the school year, and we still anticipate having everything completed by the fall of 2020.

SUPERINTENDENT'S POSITION

This year my role will change as I am sharing the superintendent position with the West Sioux district. My days will be split between the two districts. This year I will be at West Sioux 60% of the time and in Boyden-Hull 40% of the time. This sharing will be a cost savings to the district, but also allow us to look at some possibilities in how we structure our administration team.

UPDATE FROM THE JR/SR HIGH

SCHOOL Dan Pottebaum, Principal **Welcome Back Students & Staff!**

Summer 2019 has been a busy one with Phase I (Band/Vocal Area & Ag/Industrial Arts Area) being completed in addition to Phase II beginning. As one looks at the construction, we are excited about the possibilities while hopeful all will be ready for the start of the 2019-20 school year. If any of you have gone through renovations in your homes, the renovations in a school are no different. As ceilings or walls are exposed, hidden unknowns are found behind each corner. With that being stated, all is going well and when it is all said and done, it will be great. As student and teachers return in the fall, they will see a lot of changes. In preparation for the fall, here are some things we know that will be a reality for the 2019-20 school year as we continue the renovation process throughout the school year.

The first noticeable change will be where students will enter from the student parking lot. During the 2019-20 school year, students who are parking in south student parking lot will need to enter through the Gym/Theater Entrance before and after school. The current Student Entrance will be involved in the next stages of renovations. The Administration Entrance will again be the door that students, parents, and visitors will use when they come during the school day.

Another subtle change will be the bus loading zone for the Elementary shuttles before and after school. The bus loading zone will shift to the west and will be in front of the band classroom to the theater entrance doors. This is also due to the construction area in front of school and the Student Entrance. Elementary students will be able to wait in the Gym/Theater Entrance. Parents will be able to drop off students along the East side of school along Locust and by entering the south side of the parking lot and going through the drop off area on the north end of the parking lot. We are still working through some other areas as we approach August and will provide more information at School Registration about this topic.

An additional change is in the daily schedule for the school day. As a school district, we have decided to add 10 minutes to the school day (5 minutes at the beginning and 5 minutes at the conclusion). With our construction schedule and how the calendar days fall this school year, this will enable us to begin on August 27th and conclude the school year on May 21st (barring that we do not have a winter like last year). As a district, we go by hours and not by days. This will allow us to get the required hours in the school year and allow us some flexibility for inclement weather and state events and still be out before Memorial Day. This also allows for a little more time this summer for construction as well as more time next summer for the completion of renovations. The school day will begin each day at 8:15AM. Please encourage your students to be at school by 8:10AM. On Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Fridays; the

school day will conclude at 3:30PM. On Wednesdays, the school day will conclude at 2:30PM. As we approach this change, we ask for your support as parents to encourage your students to arrive early to allow them to get ready for their day and to eat breakfast prior to school day beginning. We hear from employers about things they want us to focus on in preparation for their future employees. The number one item that we hear the most is that employers want future employees to show up regularly and on time.

Last but not least, there will be some changes in faces of staff members. We want to wish Ms. Brantsen, Mrs. Johnson, and Ms. Phillips well in their new endeavors. We would also like to welcome a couple of new faces to the Boyden-Hull JH/HS building. We welcome Mrs. Mackenzie Lavellee (Art Teacher) and Mrs. Tianna Soodsma (JH Special Education Teacher) to the district. Both will beginning their first year in education and bring a lot of enthusiasm to their content area. We will also be welcoming Ms. Meghan Den Hartog and Mrs. Lynn De Stigter as para-professionals in the JH/HS building.

JH OPEN HOUSE/7th GRADE/NEW STUDENT LAPTOP ROLL OUT

On Monday, August 26th from 6:30-7:30PM, we invite all 7th and 8th grade students and their parents to come to the secondary building to meet their teachers and put their materials in the lockers. Following the Open House, we will be rolling out the Laptop computers to the 7th graders and new students to the district at 7:30PM. Attendance by the student and one parent/guardian is required for the student to receive the laptop that evening.

8TH-12TH LAPTOP ROLL-OUT

On Tuesday, August 20th, we will be distributing the laptops for grades 8th-12th grade. We will be holding 4 sessions that are each a half hour in length. We will again be going over a few housekeeping and care items with the laptops. We may have some set up for the student's laptops this year as we are beginning a new lease. We will

begin each session promptly at the following times: 6:00PM, 6:30PM, 7:00PM, and 7:30PM. We ask that each student be accompanied by a parent or guardian. You can attend any one of the four sessions. New students will receive their laptops on August 26 at 7:30PM in the HS Commons.

OPENING DAY ASSEMBLY

Parents are invited to attend the Jr/ Sr High Assembly on August 27th at 8:30AM in the B-H HS Theatre. All students in grades 7-12 and faculty members will attend this assembly. At the assembly, Mr. Pottebaum will convey the yearly expectations to the students and go over the changes to the Student Handbook.

UPDATE FROM THE ELEMENTARY

Tom Kerr, Principal

It has been a very busy summer at Boyden-Hull Elementary with Phase II of construction project starting right after school was dismissed in May. Due to the construction happening in both buildings, the school year will be starting later this year to allow more time for the contractors. We have Open House for all PS-6th graders on Monday, August 26 starting at 6:30PM and the first day of school on Tuesday, August 27.

In addition, the school board approved the addition of 10 minutes onto the school day (5 min. at the start and 5 min. at the end) to help with construction and how the unusual school calendar days fell too! School begins at 8:15AM and goes until 3:30PM on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, & Friday. On Wednesday, school will be in session from 8:15AM until 2:30PM. The extra time onto the school day will allow the school district to meet the required number of student contact hours, and still be out prior to Memorial Day barring any extreme weather days or state related events.

Furthermore, the construction will make a minor change with the bus loading zone for the elementary shuttle busses before and after school. The bus loading zone will shift further down to the west in front of the band classroom

to the theater entrance doors. Elementary students will be able to wait in the Theater/Gym Entrance in case of inclement weather. Parents will still be able to drop off students along the East side of high school along Locust St., or by the south side of the student parking lot using the proper entrance and exit.

The preparation for the first day of school with the extra construction has made the summer break interesting and challenging at times. A special thank you to Daryl Egdorf, Ashley Madsen, Steph Ochsendorf, and Loni Sohl who have managed to clean and get things put back in order up until school starts in August. The following are some of the major changes in the elementary building for this upcoming 2019-20 school year:

- Students and staff will come back to school with a new playground renovation that adds a new basketball court, swings, playground surface, and walking path as part of the construction project. A special thank you to Mark & Kristi Van Voorst who are donating some gently used soccer goals to the school too!
- Parents, students, and visitors will notice new security doors installed to complement the existing call system into the building that was in place last spring. Once the school day begins at 8:15AM, everyone will have to check into the office in order to access to the rest of the building for security and safety measures.
- New carpet was installed in the 1963 addition (2nd grade, Preschool, & EL classrooms) and office areas on the stage in the middle of July. A thank you goes to the Brunsting Painting crew for a fresh coat of paint in these areas.
- The locker rooms are in the process of a major renovation as part of the construction project, and they'll be ready before school begins.

- A handicapped portable ramp is being installed to gain access to the stage, along with the widening of our SCI restroom that is taking place as well.
- Students and parents will notice a new science curriculum this school year from McGraw/Hill called Inspire Science in grades K-8th. This will help meet the new science standards that are in place throughout Iowa.
- Please welcome a few new faces at the elementary building when you see them at various times. Ms. Tina Ageson, Special Education teacher, Mrs. Mackenzie Lavellee, our new K-12 Art teacher, and Mrs. Perla Castaneda, elementary EL teacher.

PRESCHOOL START DATE

The first day for the 2019-20 Boyden-Hull Preschool will be on Thursday, September 5, 2019. Mrs. Annie Van Der Zwaag will be contacting you in August to arrange a required home visit prior to the preschool start date.

TITLE I READING

Title I reading instruction at Boyden-Hull Elementary is usually done with students in grades K-4. Students are given instruction in small-group settings based on the student's needs as determined by the classroom teacher and testing that is done within our school. We use the ISASP and FAST test results to help determine a student's eligibility.

Students who demonstrate the need for reading instruction will be grouped by skills and age. All of our Title I teachers are assigned to these small groups to teach reading skills needed by students. These are fully certified teachers with all the necessary reading endorsements required by state and federal law. If you have any questions about the Title I program, please visit with one of the Title I teachers or Mr. Kerr, the elementary principal, during our Open House on Monday, August 26, 2019, from 6:30-7:30PM.

SCHOOL PICTURES

School pictures will be taken on Tuesday, September 10th for Elementary Students and Wednesday September 11th for JHHS Students. Your child will be given an envelope with information about ordering school pictures a week or so prior to this date. Pictures will begin right away in the morning at the Elementary, and around noon at the Jr/Sr High School. Students will hand their envelopes directly to the photographer at the time of their picture. Even if a student or family decides not to purchase the pictures, they will need to take the picture for the annual Yearbook.

I would also remind seniors to give Mrs. Hibma a senior picture as soon as possible along with a baby picture. It seems every year we are scrambling for a few students to turn these pictures in for the Yearbook and the Senior Video.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES

Supply lists will be in the registration packets.

Backpacks and P.E. bags need to fit in a locker without causing damage to the locker's latch and hinges. Repair for damage to a locker is the responsibility of the student assigned to that locker. Students will need book covers for many of their courses. It seems like at the start of the year, many of the retail stores run out of the commercial book covers. I would encourage students to "Think Green" and use a brown paper bag from the grocery store. Another useful item for students is an accordion folder to help keep their papers and other materials organized. We will be providing the JH students with a daily planner. We would also encourage students to use the Google Calendar and Stickies on their laptops for their calendars. Students can share their Google Calendars with their parents so parents know when assignments, projects, and other test and quizzes are planned.

ATHLETIC BOOSTER CLUB

The Athletic Boosters will have Comet & Nighthawk items available, forms for Comet Volleyball and Nighthawk Football order-only apparel, and sale items available during registration in Hull on Aug 7-8, and in Boyden during the Elementary Open House on Aug 26.

HEALTH-RELATED REQUIREMENTS

Students in all grades need to have the required immunizations before the first day of school. Please check with your health care provider to make sure that your child has had the immunizations and tests needed for school. The school is required to have a copy of your child's current immunization record on file. Pre-K, Kdg, & TK students are required to have all immunizations per age prior to beginning school. **New requirements have been made for 7th and 12th grade students.**

A Health Physical is required for Preschool age students. Your Physician must complete the form, and you should return the forms to the school as soon as possible.

A dental exam is required for 9th grade and Kdg students. For 9th graders, a screening completed within one year prior to enrollment is acceptable. For Kdg. students, a screening done between ages 3 to 6 is acceptable.

A vision screen is required by the State of Iowa for all students in Kdg & 3rd grade. Completed forms need to be returned to the school office as soon as possible.

Athletic physicals are required for students who participate in school-sponsored sports (including cheer & dance). If your child had a physical over the summer months, please send a copy to the school nurse. Physicals are good for one year. Your child will not be allowed to attend practice until a physical is on file at school.

JR/SR HIGH T.A.G. PROGRAM

The assessment process for G/T program involves several factors. Some of the tools used are the Iowa Statewide Assessment of Student Progress (ISASP), Measures of

Academic Progress (MAP), and AIMSweb test. Most students admitted into the program will score in the 95th percentile or better on their composite score or in a particular subject area. For instance, we already have in place an accelerated program in our math curriculum. We will be making efforts to add more modifications to our courses of study to better challenge our highly motivated students. These modifications may be in the form of special projects or research with the help of volunteer mentors. Some of our students have taken concurrent enrollment courses online or PSEO (Courses at Northwestern College or Dordt College). Standardized test scores are just one means of measuring a student's inclusion in the Talented and Gifted Program.

Often teachers will recognize students who have an exceptional interest or ability in a particular subject area. Efforts will be made to foster that student's knowledge beyond the regular classroom work. These teacher recommendations will be factored in with other qualifications for the program.

Students may also request participation in the program. A highly motivated student willing to work beyond the required classroom levels is surely a candidate for this program. Usually in these cases a performance test is given to assess the level of the student's ability. A final decision on being in the program will be made by an appointed faculty committee. This part of the program could lead to enhancements of the classroom requirements.

Gifted and talented opportunities are available in general intellectual, specific academic, creativity, leadership, or visual and performing arts areas. This is why we would like students interested in the program to fill out the information form as a spring-board for our efforts to get the program started as soon as possible in the fall.

Giftedness has many faces. The Boyden-Hull School District recognizes the need to provide all students with opportunities and experiences that will

OPTIONAL STUDENT INSURANCE

Optional student accident insurance will be available. There are separate coverage plans for at-school, field trip, 24-hour, and high school football. The insurance provider is Markel Insurance. You will enroll using their website: <http://markel.sevencorners.com>. The secure website provides information on the various coverage and premium options, answers of frequently asked questions, and allows you to purchase the insurance using a credit/debit card. If you have questions or need help

filing a claim, contact Koele Insurance (439-1122). Additional information will be available at registration.

As you decide whether or not to purchase this plan, please keep in mind that the school's liability insurance plan has a specific exclusion regarding medical payments for student injuries.

SCHOOL MESSENGER

For the past few years, the district has been using the SchoolMessenger notification system for weather notices. Please note that any phone number or email addresses that you provide to include in your child's JMC account will carry over into the SchoolMessenger contact database. If you have a preference on how you'd like to receive these messages, you may go to <https://contactme.schoolmessenger.com/?u=boydenhull>, and contact the district office for the ID number of your child(ren). If you need any help with this process, please contact Julie Johnson in the District Office.

Around the time we started using the SchoolMessenger program, the legislature passed a law limiting services such as this from contacting mobile numbers without permission. The purpose of this law is to prevent unknown and uncontrollable data charges that your phone/plan may not be set up for. In order to receive announcements on your cell phone, please text 'Yes' to 67587. You should receive a confirmation message explaining that your mobile number is enrolled in emergency messages for Boyden-Hull Community Schools.

program begins after Labor Day on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3:30PM to 5:30PM, ending the 1st week in May. Complete the Kids Club worksheet included in the packet if you would like your child to attend or volunteer.

OPEN ENROLLMENT OPTION

Parents/guardians considering open enrollment for their child(ren) into another school district in Iowa need to be aware of the following deadlines for filing the required paperwork.

- March 1, 2019 -was the last date for regular open enrollment requests for the 2019-20 school year.
- September 1, 2019 is the deadline for incoming kindergarten students only.
- Enrollment deadlines for the 2020-21 school year are March 1, 2020 for regular open enrollment requests and September 1, 2020 for incoming kindergarteners.

Applications received after these deadlines will not be approved unless the reason for late filing qualifies for "good cause." There are a number of state-approved reasons that qualify for "good cause," including moving to a new district and change in the parents' marital status.

Transportation assistance may be available for parents/guardians of open enrolled students who meet the eligibility guidelines. This may be actual transportation or a cash stipend at the resident district's discretion.

Families also need to know that open enrollment may result in the loss of athletic eligibility.
